Show Rules and Regulations

The Evergreen Primary Dressage Show is a sanctioned Primary competition member of Equine Canada. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of the EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book

Entries:

All Entries must be received **before July 15th, 2005** or will be subjected to a late fee of \$15.00 (if accepted). If you are interested in riding a test not listed on the Entry Form please contact Connie @849-2232.

Any entry received by the show committee that does not include; completed entry form, signed waiver, payment in full, proof of Flu & Rhinos inoculations and proof of NBEA membership, will be rejected.

Dress, Saddlery, and Equipment:

Whips are optional and must not exceed 1.25 m (4'1"). The uses of martingales, bit guards, running reins, boots, etc. are strictly prohibited. The use of polo wraps in the show ring, warm-up and during award ceremony is permitted. Bridles must be snaffle and black or brown in colour. English saddles must be black or brown in colour. Spurs are permitted. Riders are to wear a dark, short riding coat, tie stock or choker, light colored breeches, gloves and black boots with heels. See article 2.20 (c. and d.) of the Equine Canada Rule Book for further information. All junior competitors must wear approved protective headgear, at all times, when mounted.

Memberships & Liability Insurance:

All competitors are **required** to be NBEA (or equivalent provincial body) members. Horses must be covered by third party liability to compete in this event.

Awards & Awards Ceremony:

Special Awards will be awarded to the horse and rider combination that receives the highest average score over two (2) tests at the same level. Ribbons are awarded to 5th place. Awards for all the completed morning classes will be awarded at the lunch break. For afternoon classes the ceremony will take place 30 minutes after the last ride of the day. All competitors are required to be in full riding attire with their horses bridled for this presentation. Pictures will be taken of all the award winners for the respective sponsors.

Vaccinations & Drug Testing:

Proof of current flu & rhino vaccines must be submitted with the entry. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may, while on the competition grounds, be selected for equine medication control testing.

Competition Guidelines:

All tests will be ridden in a 20m x 60m sand ring. Dressage Tests may be found on the Dressage Canada Website.

A warm up ring is available, however no lunging is permitted.

All riders must display their competition numbers, when riding, at all times.

All scores from this show will be recognized by NBEA & DNB, but are not nationally recognized by EC.

General:

The show organizers, sponsors, or property owner do not accept any responsibility for accidents or illness to horses, riders, grooms, spectators, or any other persons – see "Declaration for Show Participation" on entry form.

The show organizing committee reserves the right to refuse an entry, and limit the number of entries or tests ridden.

The Judge's decision is final in all classes. The Judge reserves the right to excuse any unmanageable or lame horse or any rider abusing the horse.

Stabling:

Stabling is available on site and is \$20/day or \$35 for weekend, if you are also entered in the Horse Trials. The Horse Trials is scheduled for Sunday, so please indicate on the entry if you are involved with both shows.

Refunds:

After closing date, refunds of 80% of test fees will be awarded with veterinarian's certificate. The administration, drug test, and stabling fees are not refundable. Cancellation/scratches after July 21st are non refundable. Documentation must be received within 5 days of the competition.
